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26.01.16-12	<p><b>McGowan Fish Hatchery</b> needs to be expanded. Moved and seconded, 'A letter is to be written to NS Dept. Of Fisheries, Inland Division, to express the need for more containment for hatching and growing trout at McGowan's.' Michael and Horace will put points to paper and forward to the Minister.</p> <p><b>Update 31 May 16:</b> Michael has drafted a letter to NS Inland Fisheries in support of an expansion to McGowan Fish Hatchery.</p> <p><b>Update 20 December 16:</b> Mike sent a letter to Keith Colwell and is awaiting a reply. The letter included an invitation to join Michael on the river for a day of fishing, as well as MRSA's expression of support for the growth of McGowan's. Further discussed was the need for policing poachers, and potential fencing at the hatchery.</p> <p><b>Update 31 January 17:</b> MRSA received a response from Keith Colwell, Minister NS Fisheries and Aquaculture, regarding the angling potential on the Medway and the role of the provincial hatcheries. Keith suggests a meeting with the Inland Fisheries Division staff, in late winter, to further discuss ideas. Michael and Ronnie will avail themselves to Keith.</p> <p><b>Update 26 April 17:</b> Darryl has not contacted Michael; therefore, Michael will contact Darryl.</p> <p><b>Update 10 Oct 17:</b> Michael received letter of 'thanks' from Keith Colwell for the support MRSA expressed in regards to an expansion at McGowan Fish Hatchery.</p> <p>Darryl Murrant and Michael have not communicated to discuss 'the angling potential on the Medway' or 'the role of the provincial hatcheries.'</p> <p><b>Update 24 January 18:</b> Due to lack of communication between Darryl Murrant and Michael membership discussed and agreed to invite Mike MacNeil to a meeting to discuss the role of NS Inland Fisheries. Michael will contact members of the Salmon Assoc. from the Margaree area to discuss 'special status' that may be available on Margaree River.</p>	A	Michael

31.01.17-06	<p><b>Lime</b> – the pH has not been tested at the Charleston Hatchery. Mike McNeil from McGowan's Hatchery will be contacted regarding lime.</p> <p><b>Update 26 April 17:</b> Michael will collect the pH equipment from Brian Dulude. <b><u>See new business 26.01.17-12 regarding lime.</u></b></p> <p><b>Update 10 Oct 17:</b> Michael will email Brian Dulude regarding the equipment. Ronnie has a set of walkie talkies that belong to MRSA. Ronnie will continue to store the walkie talkies.</p> <p><b>Update 24 January 18:</b> Michael has not yet been in touch with Brian regarding the equipment.</p>	A	Michael

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26.04.17-12	<p>Michael proposed that the association restart a liming project. Lime will be distributed at a number of salmon spawning areas along the Medway. Michael will start the leg work involved for the project, ie. obtaining permits, type of lime required, purchase of lime, storage of lime, distribution of lime, time line for installation of lime, etc. Estimation of length of time required to complete the project is 6-8 months. Once Michael has collected the information required he will arrange an Environmental Committee meeting to put the plans in action.</p> <p><b>Update 10 Oct 17:</b> Rob Harlow has indicated to Michael that 4/5 truck loads of lime are available to MRSA. The lime has been stored for a number of years and it is time to relocate it to sites decided by MRSA. Michael will inquire as to whether Harlow Construction will deliver. Michael will contact Mike McNeil, McGowan's, regarding required permits.</p> <p>Before any lime goes into the watershed, adjacent water is to have pH tested.</p> <p><b>Update 24 January 18:</b> Once spring weigh restrictions are removed from the roads the lime will be delivered and dumped at Horace's property. The need of permits to disperse lime into the watershed will still have to be investigated. Amy Weston, NS Adopt a Stream, will be contacted as well as Mike McNeil. Discussed was the method in which the lime will be dispersed, ie. spreaders and stone slingers. The acquisition of the lime is a result of 'leftover' lime from the now defunct Jordan River Association.</p>	A	Michael
10.10.17-02	<p><b>Environmental Committee Report –</b> Ronnie will coordinate the 'adipose fin' clipping at McGowan's with members from MRSA once Mike MacNeil has established the date that Inland Fisheries will be working on this project. Ronnie will discuss the availability of fish for the Charleston Hatchery and the Fish Friends School Projects with Mike at McGowan's. He will keep Michael F. in the loop.</p> <p>To date there are no environment meetings scheduled. If an idea presents itself to Ronnie he will then get in touch with the Enviro. Committee. NS Inland Fisheries will still place fish within the Medway River system before the fishing season. Ronnie is gearing up towards another year of Fish Friends. A replacement tank will have to be purchased for the Greenfield School. Motion was carried to purchase a new tank. SQJH's tank should be set up next week in preparation for eggs. Ronnie is awaiting word as to which teacher will be responsible for the Fish Friend program before the equipment at Wickwire Elementary is installed. Incubator boxes will be installed at the Charleston Hatchery Saturday @ 1:00, 27 Jan. Ronnie pointed out that egg mortality during transportation is greater as the eggs age so the sooner Charleston Hatchery is ready to receive eggs the better.	I
